

Expenditure of Sports Premium Funding 2016-2017

Colliers Green is a half form entry school with a proud sporting tradition. The school receives £8447 in School Premium money for the academic year 2016-17. The school will use this money to employ a specialist PE teacher who will teach all the classes PE once a week, help class teachers to develop their own planning and teaching, oversee assessment and prepare teams and squads for inter and intra school competitions.

The funding is provided by the government to ensure impact against the following Objective:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.
